

# Year 7 Catch Up Premium Strategy 2018-19

**Amount of Year 7 Catch Up funding received 2018-19: £7000 (Projection)**

To support 14 pupils in Year 7.

**No pupils in Year 7 met end of KS2 expectations in Year 6, as a result pupils will receive additional Maths or Literacy support from a HLTA once a week.**

## How will the school measure the impact of the Catch-Up Interventions?

To measure progress on attainment within individual pupils Red Progression Folders. This will be monitored by AHT at each meeting with the Year 7 Catch-Up HLTA. During the progress meeting with the HLTA, the school will review the impact of actions taken and monitor the progress made by looking at examples of work on Tapestry and at that data.

Year 7 Catch-Up Funding and the impact of this is a regular item on the governing body agenda and termly meetings between the AHT and Nominated Governor will take place to discuss the impacts.
